




Joyously, the father ran to his returning son. He kissed the boy, and hugged him.


"Father, I have sinned. I'm not worthy to be your son." The boy wanted to ask his father to hire him as a servant.


But Father interrupted. "Bring the best robe, sandals, and a ring for my son. And prepare for a great party."




There was a wonderful party because the son who was lost had been found.


God knows we have done bad things, which He calls sin. The penalty for sin is death.




The first story was about a man with a hundred sheep. One got lost.


The shepherd searched and searched until he found the sheep. Then he put it on his shoulders and carried it home joyfully.


Sweep! Sweep! Sweep! The lady looked everywhere.


Finally she found the lost coin. She was very happy. Can you guess what she did? Yes, she told all her friends!


Again Jesus said, "There is joy in the presence of God's angels over one sinner who repents."


The third story Jesus told was the saddest. It spoke of a boy who left his father's home.


In a far country the boy spent his money foolishly. Now what could he do? To make matters worse, a famine came. The boy could starve to death.


Desperate with hunger, the boy got a job feeding pigs. But no one fed him. He would have eaten the pig's food gladly. Perhaps he did!
