

So Jesus said, "Come." Bravely, Peter stepped out of the boat onto the water, and walked toward Jesus.




But when he saw the wind swirling, Peter was afraid, and began to sink. He cried, "Lord, save me!"

The disciples woke Jesus, crying, "Master, Master, we are perishing!"







AND THE WIND CALMED . . . THE SEA BECAME PEACEFUL AND STILL.





The disciples marveled, saying, "Who can this be, that even the winds and the sea obey Him!"





The storm stopped them from getting across the water, even though they rowed for hours.





The disciples didn't know it, but they were in for a big surprise!




Somewhere between three and six o'clock in the morning, in the middle of the wind-tossed sea, ...


